


Assessment Task Force Purpose




Global Evangelization Model

EFMA Board Resolution September 1995



The Yi people, (also known as the Lolo, Losu, and Nosu) are the fourth largest minority group of China, with its constituent peoples numbering 7.1 million. Their homeland for some they have lived the longest as an independent ethnic group has been within the Daliang Shan (Greater Cold Mountains) of Southwestern Sichnan. The target population of Yi live in Yunnan province; however, they are also found in the provinces of Guizhou, and Guangxi.

The origin of the Yi people remains a mystey. The Yi language points to Thet. Caucasoid physical features suggest a connection with Indo-Iranian peoples to the west, and other aspects of their lives indicate a mongol connection. Although obviously made up from different racial steek, they are

a people now united by a common culture and beritage, shared lifestyle, and world view.

Traditionally these people were divided into two castes, the Brack Yi and the White Yi. The dominant Black Yi owned all property and controlled political affairs, while the White Yi, were tenants, serfs, and slaves to the Black Yi.

The independent Black Yi - the land owning nability of the mountains of Southwestern Sichnan Province - call themselves the Novo, or Southern Yi.





Status of Research Effort April 5, '96

- Since 11/95 197 of the 1850 researched
- Of those, 30 are fully complete
- 588 additional peoples assigned
- Photographs of 444 acquired
- Maps for 100 peoples
- 1850 with mini-profiles on WWW
- 100 of the mini-profiles have links to more detailed people profiles
